When we think about 'worldliness' many are tempted to go into overdrive in discussing dress, the music we listen to, the places we go for entertainment and even what we watch or listen to in our homes. Whether we are considered worldly is often dependent on how they think we fare against these 'tests' that they have set up. However a broader definition of worldliness is how we fare in thought, attitude and action against the principles of God and included in this is how honest and trustworthy we are in a world where other values, such as 'getting on in life', sometimes conflicts with living the way God expects of us whilst we are living in a sinful world.

Look how the Bible defines love in the text above. Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Matthew 5:44 (KJV) goes even deeper, admonishing us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute you. That you may be children of your Father in heaven.

Patient, kind, do not dishonour others, do not be easily angered - How do the politicians fighting one another match up with that, or more to the point how do we, who are called by God's name, match up to that? It is probably easier to get into battles about what we eat, wear or listen to as measures of our Christianity, than to think about whether our conduct matches up to what God expects of us, or better still whether our attitudes and motives are Godly.

Many people in the world eat healthily, are embarrassed by the lyrics of Hip Hop artists and dress modestly but it is another level to not envy, not be self-seeking and proud, not to keep records of those people have wronged us and to rejoice in being truthful when telling 'white lies' to cover ourselves or get on in the workplace and society at large is commonplace. What about loving our enemies? I mean, really? The principles of Godly living is at variance with the world and that is why they hated and killed the Jesus, who we claim to serve,

I don't believe that God would ask us to do something that is impossible for us to do through his strength, so when we read the high principles of God, we need to ask him to give us the strength we need to live up to it and the change of heart so that we will want to. The politicians are striving for some worldly honour and recognition but we need to set our sights higher by God's grace.
