I have recently watched and re-watched a film about how the Adventist Church began. The film is called 'Tell the World' and you can watch it on YouTube. It is a very powerful film that brings to life the story of a group of Christians from many denominations who, after studying the prophecy of Daniel 8:14, became convinced that Jesus was returning to this earth in 1844.

It is part of our Church history that makes some feel a little embarrassed because, of course, Jesus didn't come! At the time, this group of believers faced ridicule from many who didn't believe their prediction in the first place. Some of the group totally abandoned their belief in His coming, whilst others lost total faith in Jesus completely. Others went back to studying the prophecy again and concluded that the date was right but the event was wrong. In 1844, Jesus was not due to come to this Earth, but the date constituted a change in His ministry in the heavenly sanctuary on our behalf.

What made the film particularly powerful was the conviction shown by those who believed Jesus was coming in 1844, and their dedication to telling the world to prepare for that event. Many gave up their land, jobs and even relationships as they looked forward to His coming. As you watch it, you cannot help but ask how much are we prepared, as modern-day Christians, to give up to be ready for Christ's coming and are we, like those in 1844, willing to make sacrifices to tell the world about it?

Maybe we don't believe Jesus is coming as much as we think we do, otherwise wouldn't this be reflected in how we live? If we believe in His coming as much as we say we do, wouldn't we be driven by the need to tell our friends, families and associates; in other words, our world, that they too need be ready? Yes, the group were wrong to try and predict the date, as the Bible clearly states that no man knoweth when Christ will come (Matthew 24:36) but it is equally clear that he will come. Matthew 25 tells a series of parables and the message is that even some believing Christians will not be ready when Jesus comes and that is a sobering thought!

Just as in 1844 and maybe more so now, we face a secular and sceptical world who will mock the thought of Christ's coming. In fact the Bible predicts this in 2 Peter 3:3,4. Here it tells us that some will say 'you have be saying that for years! Where is He?' I wonder how those people felt after their disappointment in 1844, when they held onto their belief that Christ would still return in the future and were mocked for it?

If you have not watched the film 'Tell the World' yet, I strongly recommend it. Hopefully, it will inspire you to take your Christianity more seriously and be even more confident in Christ's return. We are not living in a film, this is real, and He will come. May God prepare our hearts for that time.

Looking Back at November 2016

Week of Prayer: Our annual week of prayer happened this month and started with special prayer sessions in Divine service. In the afternoon programme we prayed on different topics and areas of need and had the Word of God shared with us, complimented by musical items.
